His areas of interest include acute kidney injury, immune-mediated diseases, sepsis, and extracorporeal therapies.

Dr. Gordon is excited to join the team at CASE to provide cutting-edge therapies to dogs and cats across all of Colorado. Extracorporeal therapies (hemodialysis, hemoperfusion, and apheresis) have become more accessible in veterinary medicine and are used to effectively treat diseases where traditional medical management is unsuccessful. Dr. Gordon enjoys treating all patients requiring extracorporeal blood purification, but his true passion are patients with acute kidney injury. The kidneys have a remarkable ability to heal after injury, but unfortunately require time to regenerate new cells. Hemodialysis is used as a bridge to extend the recovery interval needed for the kidneys to heal. It is remarkable to see how well these cases do with the support early in the disease process. With Dr. Gordon's vested interest in kidneys, he is setting up a Nephrology Service at CASE to support the extracorporeal therapies service for follow-up. These are exciting times in veterinary medicine and our ability to save lives with these modalities. Dr. Gordon is invested in guiding owners through every step of the process when their loved ones undergo these therapies.
