Dr. Kyle Martin grew up in Aurora, Colorado, and attended Colorado State University, where he obtained a Bachelor of Science degree in Biomedical Sciences in 2012, a Master of Science degree in Biochemistry in 2013, and a Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine in 2017. Dr. Martin completed a one-year rotating small animal internship in medicine and surgery at WestVet Animal Emergency and Specialty Center in Boise, Idaho in 2018. Following his rotating internship, Dr. Martin completed his surgical residency at Washington State University in 2021, where he also obtained a Master of Science degree in Veterinary Sciences – Clinical and Translational Sciences, with an emphasis in minimally invasive surgery.

Dr. Martin's professional interests include minimally invasive surgery (laparoscopy, thoracoscopy, arthroscopy, and interventional radiology), orthopedic trauma surgery, and cardiovascular surgery. Dr. Martin has co-authored textbook chapters on minimally invasive suturing techniques and laparoscopic castration and sterilization techniques for the male dog, as well as several peer-reviewed publications covering topics including the treatment of canine cranial cruciate ligament disease, canine gait analysis, laparoscopic suturing, minimally invasive treatment of canine hip luxation, and training of surgeons in minimally invasive surgery. Dr. Martin obtained board certification and became a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Surgeons in February 2022.
